There are now four teams prepared to vie for the opportunity to challenge Canada's best Monopoly player in support of Algonquin College's Pembroke new campus capital campaign.

KI Pembroke, Runge Stationers, and a group of local engineers have joined Scotiabank in officially registering for the College-Opoly tournament on March 6 at the Pembroke Armoury.

The engineers have confirmed that they are bringing in the big guns as CFB Petawawa commanding officer Lt.-Col. Keith Rudderham will be a member of that team. At KI, a staff tournament will be used to play down and decide who will be on that team. More teams are expected to complete their registration over the next few weeks at what is billed as the Ottawa Valley's largest Monopoly

Tournament.

Campus dean Karen Davies said the College is very pleased with the high level of interest in this unique fundraising event.

"We have had so much support from the community and local businesses and organizations since we announced our intention to build a new campus for the Ottawa Valley.

Teams that have registered in the College-Opoly tournament have paid a \$5,000 registration fee. The fee is a donation to the College's capital campaign.

The top three teams in the tournament will advance to the championship game against Will Lusby who, at a tournament in Montreal last May, defeated 47 of the top players in the country to become Canadian Monopoly Champion.

In addition to the main tournament, the general public is invited to participate in friendly Monopoly matches for an admission fee of \$15.

Snacks will be provided and there is also the opportunity to win great prizes. Tickets to the event are limited.
