Pembroke's Wal-Mart store is encouraging its shoppers to support the new Algonquin College campus that will be built

in the city's downtown area. Beginning this Saturday, September 4th, Wal-Mart will be accepting donations towards the College's capital campaign as part of its 'Back to School Week' activities. In addition to the donations it collects from customers, Wal-Mart will also match the donations, up to \$2,000, for the new campus campaign.

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Store Manager, Bernie Boulay, says the College is an important asset to the community and the new campus will be very beneficial to the city's downtown.
