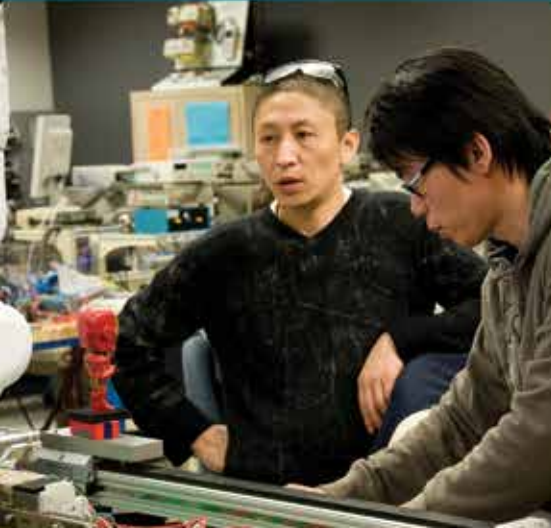

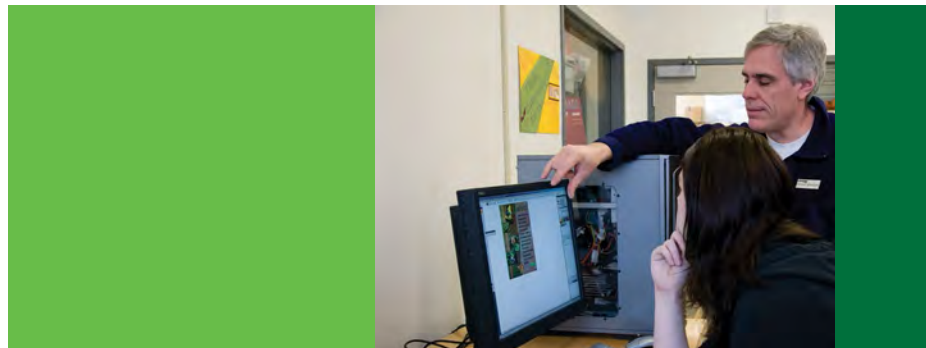

IMPORTANT DATES

Admission to the 2013 Fall Term

February 1, 2013	Deadline for applications for Equal Consideration to a program. Applications received after this date will be considered on a first-come, first-served basis as long as space is available in the program. This date also applies to the Winter and Spring Terms.
February 5, 2013	Offers of Admission for 2013 Fall are mailed to applicants for non-highly-competitive programs.
March 5, 2013	Offers of Admission for 2013 Fall are mailed to applicants for highly-competitive programs.
May 1, 2013	Applicants to 2013 Fall term must confirm their Offer of Admission on ontariocolleges.ca .
July 15, 2013	Tuition fees are due in order to hold your seat in your chosen program.
August 1, 2013	All outstanding admission requirements must be completed.
August 2, 2013	Timetables are released on ACSIS.
September 3, 2013	Start of 2013 Fall Term for most post-secondary programs.



Admission to the 2014 Winter Term

September 2013	Application processing begins (ongoing).
November 15, 2013	Tuition fees are due.
December 7, 2013	Timetables are released in ACSIS.
January 6, 2014	Start of Winter 2014 term.

Admission to the 2014 Spring Term

September 2013	Application processing begins (ongoing).
April 1, 2014	Tuition fees are due.
April 10, 2014	Timetables are released in ACSIS.
May 5, 2014	Start of Spring 2014 term.



International Students

In order to accept your Offer of Admission, send an email to the International Admission Officer who signed your Offer of Admission letter indicating that you accept the offer and will make arrangements to pay your tuition fees. If you don't, you may lose your seat in the program.

Confirming Your Acceptance into a Program

Now that you've been accepted, the most important thing you need to do is confirm your acceptance into the program. If you received Offers of Admission for more than one program, you must confirm your place into the program you want.

IMPORTANT: For the Fall 2013 term, you must confirm your acceptance through ontariocolleges.ca no later than **May 1, 2013**. If you do not confirm your acceptance by this date, you could lose your seat in the program. If you receive an Offer of Acceptance after May 1, the due date for your confirmation will be indicated on the letter of offer. For the Winter and Spring terms, confirmations are due when you receive your Offer of Admission.

Application Status

To monitor the status of your application (for example, to view what admission requirements are still outstanding, if any), login to:

Conditional Offer of Acceptance

You may receive a conditional Offer of Admission due to outstanding admission requirements. These can include:

- Official high school transcript with final grades and graduating status not received
- Proof of prerequisite courses (English, Mathematics, Sciences, etc.)
- Program-specific forms
- Portfolio or essay
- Letter of Intent
- Proof of Status in Canada (for International students)

If you receive a conditional offer, you must confirm your offer and pay your fees by the appropriate deadlines to hold your seat in the program. However, your application cannot be completed until you have met all program requirements. You should submit any required forms as soon as possible.

Outstanding Admission Requirements Deadline

If you don't submit your outstanding admission requirements by the proper deadlines, your application could be cancelled.

Winter 2014:	December 1, 2013
Spring 2014:	April 1, 2014

TUITION FEES

Fees Due Date

Once you confirm your acceptance through ontariocolleges.ca, you should pay your tuition fees as soon as they are posted to your account in June. However, to avoid losing your place in the program, you must pay your fees before the following deadlines:

Fall 2013:	July 15, 2013
Winter 2014:	November 15, 2013
Spring 2014:	April 1, 2014

If any of these dates fall on a holiday or weekend, the last date for payment or a fee deferral without penalty will be the first working day following the holiday or weekend. If your fees are not paid or you have not made arrangements to defer your fees by the deadline, you could lose your seat in the program.



Cheques and money orders must be made payable to Algonquin College. Postdated cheques will not be accepted and a fee of \$25 will be charged for all cheques returned from the bank.

Fees can be paid as follows:

Tuition Fee Deferral

Financial Aid can arrange to defer tuition payment for students receiving government assistance administered by our office. There is an online fee deferment process for students that are eligible for OSAP and a manual fee deferment process for students receiving government assistance from other provinces.

Any student qualifying for a tuition fee deferment will be charged a non-refundable \$20 administration fee for each term in which a fee deferment is processed.

Late Payments

If you miss the deadline to confirm your acceptance or pay your tuition fees, you could lose your seat in the program. If this occurs, you must contact the Registrar's Office immediately. You may be granted admission if a seat is still available in your program. If the program is full, you will be placed on the waiting list and you will be notified when a seat becomes available. If the program is closed, your application will be cancelled.

IMPORTANT: Applicants must ensure that their contact information is updated and remains current so that the College can contact them if a space becomes available.





Sponsored Students

In the absence of a sponsor's letter, it is the student's responsibility to secure tuition payment. The Algonquin College refund policy supersedes other sponsorship agreements.

If your course fees are being paid by a sponsoring agency, your employer or a government department, the sponsor must provide the Registrar's Office with an official letter of authorization before the fees due date.

Company information required:

- Organization name
- Full mailing address
- Telephone number
- Email address
- Contact person
- List of fees paid by the sponsor (tuition fees, books, etc.)
- Start and end dates of sponsorship
- Authorization signature

Information regarding student must include:

- Student's name
- Full home address
- Home and alternate telephone number
- Email address
- Student's date of birth
- Algonquin College student ID number (if available)
- Program name and term you applied for

Once proper documentation has been received, an invoice will be sent to the sponsor. Students are responsible for any fees not covered by the sponsor. A timetable will be issued to the students once registration has been processed.

Refund Policy

New students who officially withdraw in writing or cancel their application prior to the first day of their program will receive a tuition refund, less a \$40 administrative fee. Students who officially withdraw in writing within the first 10 business days from the start of term will receive a refund, less a \$100 administrative fee.

International Students should consult with the International Client Service Officer prior to withdrawal.

IMPORTANT: The refund date for most programs is 10 business days after the start of term. Students who withdraw after the refund date are not eligible for a refund.

Non-attendance and/or payment cancellation does not constitute an official withdrawal.



FINANCIAL AID


Financial Aid Services are available at the Woodroffe and Pembroke Campuses. Students at the Perth Campus can obtain Financial Aid information from the Registrar's Office. Financial assistance is available through federal and provincial student loan programs and student bursaries.



Entrance Bursaries


Algonquin College offers Entrance Bursaries to students who are enrolling in the first term of a full-time post-secondary program. These bursaries are awarded based on demonstrated financial need. Successful bursary recipients will receive a \$1,000 Entrance Bursary if enrolled in a degree program and a \$500 Entrance Bursary if enrolled in a diploma program. International Students and students who are enrolled in Certificate programs are not eligible for Entrance Bursaries.

GETTING CREDIT

ALGONQUIN COLLEGE RECOGNIZES PREVIOUS ACADEMIC AND EMPLOYMENT EXPERIENCE.

Transfer of Academic Credit (Exemptions)

Students may be eligible for a Transfer of Academic Credit (Exemption) for individual courses based on learning attained at another educational institution or at Algonquin College. We will award an exemption for courses if the learning achievements are equivalent to the course in the current program of study.

To request an exemption, you must complete the appropriate form and submit it to the Registrar's Office, along with supporting documentation (transcripts and course outlines). Once received, requests are forwarded to the appropriate academic department for final assessment. To check the status of your exemption request, log into ACSIS. If granted, the course grade will appear as 'EX' on your transcript. If denied, you will be notified by email. Processing time is approximately two to four weeks so allow sufficient time to process your request before classes begin. If your request is approved prior to the second scheduled class and you have registered for this course, a full refund for your tuition fee will be issued.

A \$10 fee applies for each external exemption request submitted and payment must be provided with the application. There is no fee for internal exemptions. Forms can be found online at:

Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR)

PLAR is a process that assists adult learners to identify, articulate and demonstrate relevant learning acquired through life and work experiences and translate this learning into college credit.

You can apply for a general education course credit using PLAR by demonstrating that you have acquired college-level learning that addresses one of the general education themes required by your program.

Advanced Standing

If you are requesting entry to a program beyond Level 01, you must apply through ontariocolleges.ca and complete the Advanced Standing Request Form, which will be sent to you following receipt of your application. You must also submit official transcripts and course outlines and the list of courses for which you are seeking transfer of academic credit. A processing fee of \$50 applies.



ORIENTATION DAYS

Woodroffe Campus

To help you prepare and make a smooth transition to college, we invite you to attend Orientation Days in late August for the Fall Term or the first week of January for the Winter Term. This orientation event provides you with the information you need to become well-prepared to begin your college program successfully.

Orientation is a great opportunity to meet other students, ask questions, get your student ID card and your OC Transpo bus pass photo and tour the College. Watch for the Orientation Days invitation and reserve your spot quickly!

Perth Campus

Campus Preview is held the Wednesday prior to the start of classes. It is a day for incoming students to tour the campus, ask questions, meet faculty, staff and classmates, purchase textbooks, parking passes and lockers, receive information on student services, meet with Financial Aid, attend Blackboard workshops, get student ID cards and much more! Watch your mail in late July for your invitation.

Pembroke Campus

Advantage Days/Orientation is usually held at the end of August. Information will be mailed to you about your program orientation.



OUR SERVICES

Books and Supplies

All required books and supplies are usually available two weeks before classes begin at the Woodroffe Campus First Class Bookstore, the Pembroke Campus Bookstore and the Perth Campus Bookstore. The bookstores also carry school jackets and rings, Algonquin crested clothing, stationery supplies and giftware selections for all seasons. Books and supplies can also be purchased online through the Bookstore website.

If you purchase your books before the start of classes, we recommend that you keep them in their original condition and keep your receipts until you can confirm you have the correct books.

Pembroke Campus

Students at the Pembroke Campus will receive book lists during Algonquin Advantage Days. The bookstore will be open evenings for Continuing Education students on the first night of classes only from 6:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

Perth Campus

Students at the Perth Campus will receive book lists in late July and can purchase textbooks from the Front Office during regular business hours.

Computers and Home Electronics

The New Technology Store at the Woodroffe Campus can assist with all your computing, consumer electronics and entertainment needs. Its broad inventory includes computers (PC and Apple), software, televisions, cellular phones, iPods, gaming consoles, board games and much more. Academic pricing is available on many product lines at up to 75% less than other retailers (valid student ID required).

Health Services

The Health Services offices located at the Woodroffe, Perth and Pembroke Campuses are open to all students and staff. You can see a registered nurse on a drop-in basis or arrange an appointment with a doctor at the Woodroffe office. Same day appointments are often available. Health Services can also help you complete medical forms required for your program.



Parking

Woodroffe Campus

Parking permits for new students at the Woodroffe Campus go on sale in early July and can be purchased online through the Parking Services website.

Perth Campus

Permits go on sale in late August.

Pembroke Campus

Permits will be on sale during Algonquin Advantage Days.

Lockers

Lockers are provided at a cost to all students registered in a full-time or collaborative program.

Woodroffe Campus

You can make early arrangements for a locker by renting it through the ACSIS website as soon as timetables are made available.

Perth Campus

Students can rent a locker and make payment arrangements at the front office during Campus Preview.

Pembroke Campus

Students will be assigned lockers during Algonquin Advantage Days in late August.



Bus Passes

Students can buy an OC Transpo photo ID card at the Parking Services office. A new photo is required each school year, and it must be used with a current OC Transpo pass. Semester passes are available through Parking Services. Pass protection is included with semester passes; it entitles you to one free replacement if your pass is lost or stolen. Monthly passes can be purchased in the First Class Bookstore.

Centre for Students with Disabilities (CSD)

The Centre for Students with Disabilities (CSD) provides assistance to students with disabilities. Our staff work with students to ensure that academic accommodations are in place to help meet their individual needs. We provide disability-related counselling to students while promoting self advocacy. The goal of our Centre is to facilitate an accessible education experience for students with disabilities. When needed, we will also provide referrals to other services. All information provided is kept strictly confidential.

Students with disabilities may be found eligible for one or more of the following services from CSD:

- Disability-related counselling and advising that is developed specifically for students with disabilities and not duplicated by regular counselling and advising services available to all students.
- Services of a learning strategist to assist with test preparation, note-taking skills, organization strategies, memory techniques and other strategies.
- Interpreter services, including manual and oral interpreting, and intervener services.
- Writing and reading technologies, such as scan and read software, texts in MP3 or other accessible formats.
- Test accommodations, such as extra time, a quiet writing environment, and use of assistive Technologies.
- Transcription services, such as Braille, large print materials, and accessible electronic text.
- Note-takers and electronic note taking for course-related activities.
- Access to, and arrangements for, assistive devices.
- Access to the Dr. John Burton Adaptive Technology Lab.
- Consultation with faculty for students with disability-related needs.
- Liaison with and referral to other Student Support Services and external agencies.
- Liaison with campus and community agencies, including referral and follow-up services to these agencies on behalf of students with disabilities.

Learning Resource Centres

The Algonquin College Learning Resource Centre offers a variety of services to support faculty teaching and student learning. It supports students by providing access to library materials as well as print and electronic resources.

The Library offers:

- Individualized web interfaces for students, faculty, staff and community members.
- Easy access to 39 database packages including access to 80,000 e-journals (scholarly journals, magazines and newspapers).
- Easy access to specialty e-resource collections including case law indexes, company profiles, online automobile repair resources and e-book collections.
- NEW! Multi-Database Search Interface. Not sure which database to use for your topic? Try the multi-database search.
- Easy access to research support, such as Subject Starters. Stuck on your topic? Start with a list of reputable websites to get your research kick-started.
- The A-Z Electronic Journal Locator. This product searches across all our print and online e-resource collections to find full-text access to the titles you seek.
- NEW! Access to videos online and on DVD. Search our catalogue for available titles or view our video databases for instant online video access.
- Need help online? Try askON our virtual reference service and chat with library staff.
- Direct access to Educational Youtube, Google Scholar, Blackboard and ACSIS.

Early Learning Centre (ELC)

The ELC is a licensed Campus Child Development Centre and student learning facility caring for children aged three months to five years. Early Childhood Educators provide a developmentally appropriate full-day program for up to 49 children.

The ELC provides learning opportunities for Early Childhood Education (ECE) students through practice and observation and is part of the School of Health and Community Studies. It is licensed by the Ontario Ministry of Community and Social Services.

Demand for spaces at the centre is high and commonly there is a waiting period before entry. You are therefore encouraged to apply at the earliest opportunities.

International Education Centre

The International Education Centre provides personal support to international students. Services include admissions, health insurance, airport pickup services, academic workshops and peer tutoring, assistance with accommodations, orientation, social and cultural activities, visa and permit assistance.

The centre also offers specialized English as a Second Language training for those who wish to achieve English proficiency as a stepping stone to further post-secondary study.

Mamidosewin Aboriginal Student Centre

The Mamidosewin Centre provides a welcoming and supportive environment for First Nations, Inuit and Métis students. We offer career, academic and personal counselling, as well as access to Elders, traditional teachings, ceremonies and cultural gatherings. The centre has a study space, small computer lab with printer and kitchenette for student use. Social and cultural activities are held weekly.





Food Services

Whether you have allergies, dietary constraints or simply strive for a healthier lifestyle, Food Services offers a wide variety of menu options guaranteed to satisfy your needs. Students can be assured that well known, top-quality brand name products are used in our dining facilities.

Meal Plans

We offer several meal plan options that work on a declining balance system using your Algonquin Student ID Card. When you purchase your Meal Plan, food dollars are deposited into your account. Once you have chosen your Meal Plan, you simply present your Algonquin Student ID Card to the cashier at any of our eight locations. The appropriate food dollars from your selected Meal Plan will be deducted from your account. You may ask the cashier for a receipt after any purchase to view the balance available on your Meal Plan. Meal Plans are not available on the Pembroke and Perth Campuses.

Important: All first-time Residence students must select one of the Full-Year Meal Plan options.

The Observatory (Woodroffe) and The Landing (Pembroke)

Student lounges are operated by the Students' Association at each campus. You can relax near the fireplace, play a game of pool, watch TV and have something to eat.

The Observatory now accepts the Student Meal Plan card on all food items and serves STARBUCKS coffee. A variety of entertainment is scheduled throughout the year.





Students' Association (SA)

The Students' Association is a not-for-profit corporation whose mission is to create an environment that inspires a passion for student success. The SA is governed by a Board of Directors made up of nine students and is run by a full-time staff. Together, they work to ensure that your concerns are heard and addressed and that you receive the assistance you require to succeed. The SA has offices at each campus.

Student Employment Services

Algonquin College offers a comprehensive employment service that matches qualified students and graduates with local employers. The Student Employment Services Office is located at the Woodroffe Campus but the services are available for all campuses. It provides training on job-search techniques and offers résumé writing and labour-market information.

Employment Officers promote full-time, part-time and summer job opportunities through bulletin boards, online postings and the Online Graduate Referral Service found in ACSIS.

Athletics

Algonquin's athletic facilities and programs are an excellent complement to your academic life. In 2005, we opened a \$4.9 million dome at the Woodroffe Campus that features a regulation-size soccer field, clubhouse and a sports therapy clinic.

Algonquin Fitness Zone

This 20,000 square foot, state-of-the-art fitness facility built by the Students' Association has everything you need to achieve your fitness goals. Also, recently added to the Fitness Zone is the Impact Zone, a place for Fitness Zone members to participate in Thai Boxing, Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu and Mixed Martial Arts classes.

Recreation Leagues

Students can join one of many recreation leagues offered such as floor hockey, badminton, basketball, volleyball and indoor soccer, touch football, cricket and ice hockey. Students at the Pembroke Campus can participate in intramural sports including basketball and ball hockey in the new outdoor court.

Thunder Varsity Sports

Be a part of the THUNDER experience! Fully funded by the Students' Association, teams include men's and women's soccer, men's and women's rugby, volleyball, basketball and curling. We have some of the best teams in the province! Try out for a team or come to a game and help your mascot Thor cheer on the THUNDER.



Counselling Services

Counselling Services offers academic and career planning for prospective students. We provide a free 30-minute interview with a counsellor to help you clarify your career goals and identify suitable programs to attain those goals. We can assist with a variety of issues including:

- Referrals

Housing

The Students' Association (SA) helps students search for off-campus accommodation year-round. Rental listings for apartments, houses and rooms are posted on the SA website. City maps, bus maps and information on tenant rights are also available at the Woodroffe campus office. Students joining Algonquin for the Fall term should start looking for accommodations as soon as possible because spaces fill up quickly.

Residence Services

Get the full college experience by living on campus at Algonquin's Residence. It presents students with a great opportunity to meet new friends, join clubs, attend social events, join committees and fully emerge yourself in all that the college has to offer.

Located at the Woodoffe Campus in Ottawa, this 1,050-bed facility is available to new and returning students. Every two-bedroom suite includes a full bathroom and a kitchenette equipped with a fridge and microwave. Barrier-free suites are available upon request.

Acceptance into residence is allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. Applications for the Fall 2012 term and the Winter and Spring 2013 terms can be submitted online through our new student portal at www.algonquincollege.com/residence. Applicants are advised to apply as early as possible.

Students that apply after the deadline are placed on a waitlist. Residence will mail out a Notification of Waitlist or a Notification of Acceptance letter to students. A Notification of Acceptance will include all necessary paperwork and forms for residency. A Notification of Waitlist will include terms of the waitlist and the waitlist procedure. It is your responsibility to contact the Residence if you have not received a notification. If you are placed on a waitlist and a spot becomes available, Residence will contact you by telephone and you will have 48 hours to claim your spot.

Everyone accepted into Residence must fill out a personality profile. This profile contains a variety of questions about your social habits, interests and musical tastes. Based on these profiles, we will place you with a roommate of the same gender with similar interests. If you have a friend who will also be living in Residence, you can include their name on the profile survey. If you request each other, we will try our best to ensure you are placed in the same room. There are no co-ed suites.

Important: Residence fees must be sent separately to Residence, not to the Registrar's Office with your tuition fees.

- Complete and submit an Entrance Bursary application if you are in a diploma or degree program.
